### **HOST CITY**

Split is a cultural, tourist, and commercial center of Dalmatia. Split is also the second biggest city of Croatia. Its central location, mild climate and unique cultural treasures are a great attraction. The most famous monument in Split is Diocletian's Palace, which is on the world heritage list of UNESCO. This city was of no importance during Greek and Roman times, probably it would have remained so if the native Diocletian who rose from soldier to Roman emperor had not chosen the city as the site for his palace. The promenade, the railway station and the bus station are all situated next to each other at the beginning of the seaside alley of palms. This is the central part of the city where the palace, which was built of white stone from Brock Island, and Italian and Greek marble hides behind 66 foot high town walls not far from here. When the 430 square foot group of palaces was erected neither the town walls nor the houses attached to it existed.

You just walk slowly, pondering the zigzag streets paved with heavy stones inherited from ancient times and watch the extravaganza of houses all in a heap built among crumbling gray walls of the enormous palace, the place inhabited by thousands of people even today.

The past was actually lost in the mists of time in these streets and alleys. Among these people who lived their everyday life here, inside the marble walls, there's simply no sign of the echo of distance. No engraving can be seen and there's no trace of the presence of old rulers. A new life has begun between the old walls. The 21st century throbs in the shade of the palace.

### 2015 GIGLIOLA GORI JUNIOR SCHOLAR AWARD

The prize is awarded for an unpublished essay of outstanding quality in the field of sport history. Eligible scholars must be a member of ISHPES and a registered student (undergraduate or graduate) at the time of the Congress or a young scholar (within one year of receiving a PhD). The essay must be submitted in ENGLISH and the text itself (including notes and bibliography) must not exceed 10,000 words. The main criteria for selection will be based on originality, the scientific quality of the research and the value of the study from the perspective of international sport history.

The award winner will receive 1000€ (one thousand euros) and free registration at the Congress and a year's membership to ISHPES. His/her paper will be published in the international journal STADION and the winner, together with any other entrant whose work is recognized by the committee for its quality, will receive a diploma that will be presented during the Congress.

Essays must be submitted to Gigliola Gori, Chair of the Awards Committee, by email no later than May 30, 2015: awards@ishpes.org The award will be presented at the 2015 ISHPES Congress.

### GERD VON DER LIPPE JUNIOR SCHOLAR FUND

Graduate students presenting papers at the ISHPES Congress are eligible to apply for a travel grant from the Gerd von der Lippe Junior Scholar Fund. The money will be divided among the applicants to help defray the costs of travel and accommodation at the conference. Exact amounts of the financial support will vary.

A graduate student requesting travel funds must make a request for a Gerd von der Lippe Junior Scholar Fund grant at the same time as the abstract submission. Applications should consist of a concise letter from the prospective participant requesting a grant from the Gerd





von der Lippe Junior Scholar Fund, sent to Dr. Sandra Heck, ISHPES General Secretary, at info@ishpes.org.

### Requirements:

- 1) Be a current ISHPES member,
- 2) Include applicant's academic affiliation,
- 3) Include the name and email address of applicant's graduate program advisor

Funding requests will have no bearing on the scientific committee's decisions on panels, but funds will not be awarded unless the applicant's paper is accepted by the scientific committee in a separate decision.

All recipients must register for the ISHPES conference in advance. This financial support will be disbursed to recipients by the ISHPES General Secretary at the conference. The winner of the Gigliola Gori Junior Scholar Award is not eligible for financial support from the Gerd von der Lippe Junior Scholar Fund.

### ROUTLEDGE JUNIOR SCHOLAR PRESENTATION AWARD

Graduate students who present papers at the ISHPES Congress are eligible for the Routledge Junior Scholar Presentation Award. The Junior Scholar(s) who deliver the best paper presentations will be recognized at the end of the ISHPES Congress and will receive £75 (seventy-five pounds only) worth of books of their choice from Routledge.

Routledge Junior Scholar Presentation Award winners will be selected based on the following criteria: a) Paper topic contributes to the field, b) Presenter develops the topic well (organized, clear and concise), c) Presenter's vocal presentation is audible and engaging, d) Presenter's PowerPoint slides are well designed (readable fonts, good balance of graphics and text), e) Presenter handles audience questions/comments well (demonstrated greater depth of topic, discussion enhanced conference participants' understanding of the topic).





We invite you to submit abstracts within the announced topic and subtopics of the Conference.

Participants are invited to submit their abstracts for podium/oral presentations only.

Any submitted paper or abstract will be internationally reviewed and evaluated in order to decide on its acceptance. Nevertheless, the submitting authors are responsible for the statements and views expressed in their works, as well as for the editing style and quality of language. The official language of the Congress is English. Only the accepted abstracts will be included in the Scientific Program and printed in the Book of Abstracts provided that the submitting author (the first author) has paid the fee.

All abstracts must fit within the allotted size requirement to be considered for review. The abstract must be 350 words or less including title, names of the author(s) and affiliation(s).

### **Editing guidelines:**

Print the title of the abstract in capital letters, centered; a single blank line follows, then come the full names of the author(s), separated by commas; introduce the last complete name by "and". Underline the presenter. There should be no blank line-separation between author(s) and affiliation(s). Relate each author to the respective institution(s) by an identification number in the superscript. Institutions should be introduced by their identification number, the name of the institution, city, and country. Institutions should be separated by semicolons. The identification number is redundant if all the authors are affiliated with the same institution. A single blank line should separate the affiliation(s) from the abstract. Please, omit any university degrees and positions, titles, streets, etc.

The International Journal of the History of Sport is the world's leading sport history academic periodical with its fully-refereed global coverage of the subject. The journal offers a forum and seeks to explore the relationship between sport and society in a historical context.

1441, online ISSN 1848-638X) is published by University of Zagreb Faculty of Kinesiology since 1971. Kinesiology publishes scientific papers and other written material twice a year from kinesiology (a scientific discipline which investigates the art and science of human movement; in the meaning and scope close to the idiom "sport sciences") and other adjacent human sciences focused on sport and exercise, primarily from anthropology (biological and cultural alike), medicine, sociology, psychology, natural sciences and mathematics applied to sport in its broadest sense, including history and others. Contributions of high scientific interest, including results of theoretical analyses and their practical application in physical education, sport, physical recreation and kinesiotherapy are accepted for publication. The following sections define the scope of the journal: sport and sports activities, physical education, recreation/leisure, kinesiological anthropology, training methods, biology of sport and exercise, sports medicine and physiology of sport, biomechanics, history of sport and book reviews with news.

### By air:

The Radisson Blu Resort is only 22 kilometers from Split International Airport and can be reached by taxi, bus or boat.

### By car:

The A1/E65 motorway from Zagreb connects Split to several other major destinations in Europe. The hotel's nearest cities are Zadar (158 km), Dubrovnik (220 km), Rijeka (370 km) and Zagreb (385 km). Once on the motorway take the exit for Dugopolje/Split, and the hotel will be 15 kilometers away.

### By ferry:

The mainline Jadrolinija ferry connects Split with Rijeka or Dubrovnik and all central Dalmatian Islands. Regular international ferry lines run from Ancona and Pescara in Italy. The ferry port and main bus and train stations are three kilometers away.
